# APPLICATION INFORMATION

#### **TYPE OF AGREEMENT:** Student Exchange and Cooperation

#### **APPLICATION DOCUMENTS**

Partner universities will nominate eligible students directly to the OEA office using the nomination form. Upon acceptance of student nominations, students must complete and submit the following documents to the online application portal:

- Online FIU Non-Degree seeking application (separate application, not included in online ISE application)
- **Exchange Application Questionnaires**
- **Policy Signature Documents**
- **Declaration of Finances Form and Funds Availability** Letter
- TOEFL or IELTS Scores\*\*
- Immunization Forms (link)
- **Exchange Student Course Selection Form**
- Scan/copy of Valid Passport (Must be valid for 6 months after the end date of your program.)
- Academic Transcripts (students must have a minimum 3.0/4.0 GPA): signed/stamped by the home University.
- **Insurance Enrollment Form**
- **Housing Contract** (to be submitted online)

#### **ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY**

FIU will accept the following to meet the language assessment requirements:

- TOEFL: IBT minimum score: 80 or PBT minimum score 550
- IELTS: Minimum score 6.5
- \*Taken within the last 2 years
- \*\*Students whose degree programs are taught entirely in English, must submit a signed letter from their academic advisor or exchange coordinator confirming that they are enrolled and participating in a fully English-taught program. After that, we can waive the Evidence of English fluency requirement.



# **ACADEMIC INFORMATION**

#### LEVEL/COURSE/PROGRAMS OFFERED

<u>Undergraduate and Graduate</u> – FIU offers both Undergraduate (courses numbered 1000- 4000 level) and Graduate courses (coursed numbered 5000 or above).

The terms of our specific agreement, as well as balance and availability, determine whether we can accept Undergraduate, Graduate, or both types of students from your institution.

**Please note** that courses and programs in the College of Medicine and the College of Law are <u>excluded</u> from all exchange agreements. Courses in the graduate programs are limited.

#### **COURSE LOAD PER SEMESTER**

<u>Undergrad:</u> 12 credits minimum, 15 credits maximum (4-5 classes)

<u>Graduate:</u> 9 credits minimum, 12 credits maximum (3-4 classes)

#### CREDIT SYSTEM

FIU uses the Carnegie Unit system. In this system, most standard courses are 3 credit hours each.

There are no Pharmacy courses.

Additionally, certain courses are NOT open to exchange students, including, but not limited to:

- Graduate Business/Finance courses: Unless the institution specifically has a Graduate Business exchange agreement. Even then, graduate business exchange places are part of professional programs and only available on a case-by-case basis.
- Graduate Engineering & Mass Communication Courses
- Capstone courses: These are reserved for graduating degree-seeking FIU students.
- Courses offered at "Virtual Undergraduate Campus"

#### **COURSE SELECTION PROCEDURE**

Students submit course schedule request & proof of prerequisite completion, if applicable, to OEA. Once pre-requisite reviews are complete, OEA registers exchange students for courses. Proof of prerequisite completion is especially important for courses in certain departments (Business, Communications, Sciences, Computer Sciences/Information Technology, Social Work, Engineering, Education etc.).

# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

#### **ACCOMODATION**

<u>On-Campus Housing</u> (depending on stipulations of our agreement): OEA notifies accepted exchange students once the exchange housing application is available. Students must complete the housing agreement by the specified deadline, as housing is assigned on a first-come, first-served basis, according to availability. ## HEALTH INSURANCE

According to the Florida Board of Governors and FIU policy, all international students with a J-1 visa status must have medical insurance **before** the beginning of their exchange program.

Inbound ISE Students **must** complete the medical insurance requirement by:

Or

<u>Submitting an International Student Alternative Health Insurance Compliance Form</u> completed by your current insurance company and approved by FIU Student Health Services (<a href="https://dasa.fiu.edu/student-support/wellness/immunization-insurance/insurance-for-international-students/alternative-health-insurance/index.html">https://dasa.fiu.edu/student-support/wellness/immunization-insurance/insurance-for-international-students/alternative-health-insurance/index.html</a>)





All non-US citizens need a visa to study at FIU as an exchange student. OEA will email the student an acceptance letter and a DS-2019 form needed to apply for a <u>J-1 Student Visitor Visa</u> once the student is admitted to the exchange program at FIU. Students are responsible for applying for their own visas through the U.S. Department of State. <u>Obtaining a J-1 Student Visitor Visa before entering the U.S. is required.</u> Participation in the FIU Exchange Program is contingent upon having a valid J-1 Student Visitor Visa that covers the entire duration of the exchange.
