Applying to Syracuse University

Entry Requirements

- Undergraduates and Graduates must have completed 2 full semesters at their home institution before they can be nominated.
- Minimum GPA required is a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Transcripts must be up to date, which includes the previous semester before application submission.

Nominate Students

Students must be nominated through the nomination link found <u>here</u>. You will be able to nominate multiple students.

Once students are nominated, they can complete the application found here. They must include the following information/forms.

- Passport
- o Official Transcript (All transcripts must be in English or translated in English)

- Financial Documents
- Course Request Form (course catalog can be found <u>here</u>.)
- English Proficiency Exam Scores
 - Students whose native language is English, or who are currently enrolled in a degree program in English are not required to provide English language test results as part of their initial exchange student application.
 - However, students should be advised that they may be asked to provide an official English language test result at a later point if there is not sufficient proof for the admissions committee to complete their application review. It is recommended for all students whose native language is not English to take an accepted English proficiency exam to be prepared, should they be required later to provide test results.
 - Please review the English proficiency exam score requirements on the <u>Syracuse</u> <u>University website</u>.

Financial Requirements

International students should complete the Financial Documentation form included with this application, which requires certified copies of bank statements or a bank letter to prove funding availability. Documentation must be in English or translated in English and valid within one year of the start of the semester.

If you are an international applicant who requires an F-1 Student Visa to come to Syracuse, you must submit documentation that demonstrates the ability to fund your education for one semester or one full academic year.

Cost of Attendance

The cost of attendance for applicants to attend Syracuse University changes each academic year. This information can be found on our Exchange Student Website under Cost of Attendance. Updates for each year will not be posted until late March/April when the cost will be confirmed for the following semester.

If you are a privately or personally sponsored applicant, acceptable proof may be a signed letter of support from a bank. The certified bank statement need not show the total amount of funds in the account. Rather, it must state that the account has funds to meet your semester or full-year expenses at Syracuse University. It is not necessary for the bank statement to show the amount in US dollars; however, the currency does need to be clearly indicated.

If you are a government-sponsored applicant, you must submit a certified copy of the award letter that includes the U.S. dollar amount of the award per year, the duration of the award, and a list of expenses covered by the award.

Academic Calendar

Enrollment Options: Please note that there is limited space for exchange students in several professional degree programs. This includes the School of Architecture, and College of Visual and Performing Arts. A portfolio must be submitted and reviewed by Syracuse University prior to acceptance in these colleges. The Whitman School of Management has limited space available, and

Newhouse only accepts students from their exchange universities. Below is a list of the academic schools with their exchange student limitations (if any) noted:

- School of Architecture <u>Professional degree students only. A portfolio must be submitted</u> with application.
